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Mission

Okkodo High School provides a respectful environment for quality learning that builds knowledge and skills to succeed in the 21st century.

THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNITY

- Okkodo High School serves approximately 1,700 students in the northern village of Dededo to include low-income areas, parts of Guam's industrial zone, and a few middle to high-income neighborhoods.
- Okkodo High School participates in the Community Eligibility Provision of the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 due to a high number of student population qualifying for free or reduced meal program. Every student in the school receives free meals regardless of family income.
- The three dominant ethnicities at Okkodo High School are Filipino, Chamorro, and Chuukese (Chuuk is an island-state in the Federated States of Micronesia, FSM). Citizens from the Philippines and neighboring Micronesian islands migrate to Guam for work, educational opportunities, or for social welfare programs.
- On average, sixty-two percent of the school's population hears or speaks a language other than English at home. Three to four-hundred students are mainstreamed, with teacher modifications, and approximately sixty students are in sheltered ESL classrooms. The remaining number of ESL students have exited the program and are no longer receiving services.
- About seven percent of the school's population qualifies for special education services. OHS collaborates with Guam DOE Division of Special Education to provide services to students who qualify for Special Education.

THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

- Guam Department of Education institutes a College and Career Readiness Path to prepare students to enter the college or career fields after high school. Honors & Advanced Placement courses, Guam Community College vocational courses, and Marine Corps JROTC are offered at OHS for post-secondary preparation.
- The school offers a variety of student clubs and organizations, as well as an active athletics program.
- Okkodo High School tracks the number of students who fall below average or failed one or more of their courses in providing tutoring or co-curricular activities as part of the schoolwide intervention system (SIS) since SY 14-15.
- Teachers employ research-based strategies such as McREL's Classroom Instruction That Works (CITW), Thinking Maps (TMs), and Sheltered Instruction Observation Protocol (SIOP). Standard Based Grading (SBG) to implement proficiency scales to assess student mastery are also introduced. Formative assessments to reteach material are also given when needed.
- Special recognition or awards of OHS include: 2019 & 2020 Islandwide Mock Trial Champions and competed nationally, 2012 & 2013 MJROTC National LMP Champions, 2017 Islandwide Prostart Champions, 2017 2nd Place Prostart National Champions, NIDDK National recipients, Annual Upward Bound & ETS recipients to National Leadership Conferences, 2019 Tumon Festival Band Gold Award, 2020 National Junior ROTC Award, 2018 Clara Barton Robotics Award, and the 2019 Islandwide Robotic Champion.
- Okkodo High School has received accreditation from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges since its opening in 2008.

College Admissions & Curricular Activities

There were 304 graduates for the class of 2023. An exit survey completed by 231 of the graduates indicates that **35 (15%) planned to attend a 2-year vocational college, 117 (51%) planned to attend a 4-year college, 46 (20%) planned to enter the workforce, and 33 (14%) planned to enlist in the military.**

Seventeen students earned a certificate of Community College Career & Technical Education (CTE) High School Programs: Automotive, Carpentry, Electronics, Marketing, ProStart (Culinary), and Tourism.
