Okkodo High School provides a respectful environment for quality learning that builds knowledge and skills to succeed in the 21st century.

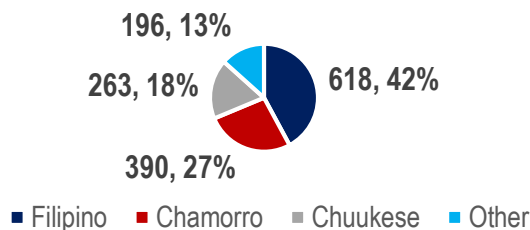
THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNITY

Okkodo High School is one of six public high schools in the Guam Department of Education. It first opened its doors in August of 2008. Situated in the Northwest village of Dededo, the institution caters for approximately 1,500. The island is the closest and most developed U.S. territory to Asia and other Micronesian islands. This makes Guam an attraction for immigrants. Okkodo High School's culturally diverse population reflects this. The school's attendance boundaries encompass various socio-economic demographics, ranging from low-income areas and segments of Guam's industrial zone, to select middle to high-income neighborhoods. Thus, school qualifies for Community Eligibility Provision of the Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010, and every student receives free meals, without regard to the household income.

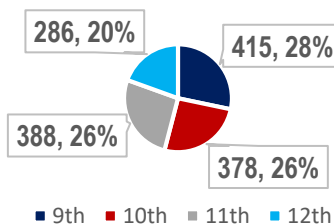
DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

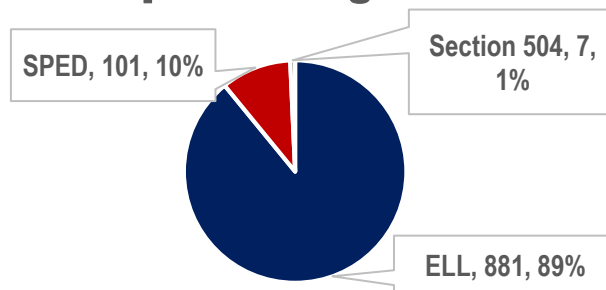
Student Ethnicity

CURRICULUM

Okkodo High School caters to the diverse needs of the student body, comprised of students pursuing higher education, on a career path, or interested in military service. For students gearing towards college, Okkodo High School offers several rigorous Honors and Advanced Placement courses to ensure academic excellence. To prepare students for the workforce, Okkodo collaborates with Guam Community College to offer courses in career technical fields such as electronics, computer networking, carpentry, and automotive. Such courses equip students with practical skills to enter the workforce. The school also prepares students for the island's second largest industry, tourism. The school has a competitive and highly successful tourism academy, marketing program, and culinary program. For students considering military service, Okkodo stands apart from other high schools by offering the Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps. Renowned for its competitiveness, the program not only cultivates leadership skills, but also offers students the opportunities for national recognition through participation in prestigious competitions and conferences. Okkodo High School has received accreditation from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges since its opening in 2008.

Dual Enrollment

Juniors and Seniors who pass the Guam Community College or University of Guam placement test may attend college level English and Math courses while still being enrolled at OHS.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

GPA is computed using percentage and quality points. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 24 credits is required for graduation. In addition, each student must complete 75 service learning hours. AP and Honors classes are weighted by one point. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed at the end of each semester.

Class of 2024

There were 316 graduates for the class of 2024. An exit survey completed by 289 of the graduates indicate that 66 (23%) planned to attend 2-year vocational college, 105 (36%) planned to attend 4-year college, 65 (23%) planned to enter the workforce, and 53 (18%) planned to enlist in the military. Eighteen students earned a certificate of mastery and 61 earned a certificate of completion in the following Guam Community College Career & Technical Education (CTE) High School Programs: Marketing, Electronics Technology, Hospitality & Lodging, and ProStart (culinary).

Advanced Placement Results

- 67 students took 77 exams
- 6% scored a grade of 5
- 33% scored 3 or higher
